FURTHER DIRECTIVES EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY FROM BISHOP G. BERGIE

- 1. **Sunday Mass** at the Cathedral will be livestreamed beginning Sunday, March 29 on the Diocesan website www.sainted.com
- 2. All Masses are cancelled until April 18, 2020 including weekday Masses
- 3. **Funeral Masses** and Reception in parishes are not permitted until further notice.
- 4. Baptisms may be celebrated privately with immediate family members present
- 5. Marriage Preparation Courses have been cancelled until end of May.
- 6. **Priests and deacons** can continue to bring Communion to the homebound. For the sick in the hospital Fr. Andy Goodwin, the Catholic Chaplain at the hospital will visit patients on behalf of the clergy of the diocese.
- 7. Spiritual Communion:

Catholics are reminded that during this extraordinary time, they are dispensed from their obligation to attend Sunday Mass. People are encouraged to make an Act of Spiritual Communion with the following prayer:

My Jesus, I believe that You
Are present in the Most Holy Sacrament.
I love You above all things,
And I desire to receive You
